Agencies and Forns out Garrison 230

NEW YORK AP - Jim Garrison, New Orleans district attorney, claims that President John F. Kennedy was killed by "a precision guerrilla team of at least seven men," and that Lee Harvey Oswald did not fire a shot. He said in a copyrighted interview in the October issue of Playboy magazine that the killers were former employes of the Central

magazine that the killers were former employes of the Central Intelligence Agency. Garrison said the killers were "involved in the CIA's anti-Castro underground activities in and around New Orleans. The CIA knows thepr identity. So do I-and our investigation has established this without a shadow of a doubt." He did not disclose these identities. The Warren Commission named Oswald as the sole assassin. Garrison told Playboy the killers acted because Kennedy "was working for a reconciliation with the U.S.S.R. and Castro's Cuba."

Cuba." He said Oswald was "involved in the conspiracy," but killed. neither the president nor Dallas police officer J. D. Tippitt. According to Garrison's theory, which he said is established by new evidence, "there were at least four men on the grassy knoll, at least two behind the picket fence and two or more behind a small stone wall to the right of the fence. "One man fired at the president from each location, while the role of his companion was to snatch up the cartridges as they were ejected."

Garrison said he also had proof that Oswald "was recruited by the CIA in his Marine Corps days." bv SS944ped Sept 11
