## State Court Studies MCC Quash Move

Louisiana Court took under advisement today the Metropolitan Crime Commission's motion to quash a subpena which would re-quire the organization to take

all of its records before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury.
Attorney Milton Brener told the court that the subpena was unreasonable and supressive in that it was too broad, requiring all records dating from the inception of the organization. ganization.

He said Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison's office is not investigating organized crime, but is investigating the MCC.
Several judges indicated that the subpena should have

been more specific.

RICHARD Burnes of the DA's office said the state is seeking any documents the MCC has on confidential in-formants and any special knowledge members have about organized crime in New

Burnes said the district at-torney's office has knowledge that one of the MCC's paid informer's lied and wants to know how much he was paid.

He said the al'eged informer testified under oath that he lied to the commission.

After the hearing Aaron M.

Kohn, managing director of the MCC, said, "We don't make accusations based on in-formation received from informants, not even Pershing Gervais."

Kohn said that Gervais, a former chief investigator for Garrison, had worked as an informant for the MCC.
