Warren Report The widely-criticized Warren Report was represented yesterday by a renowned critic as having no contact with reality.

Harold Weisberg spoke briefly to a audience of about 100 on the latest of his four books, "Oswald in New Orleans — Case for Con-spiracy with the CIA."

"Lee Harvey Oswald has been greatly misrepresented by the press and the Warren report," Weisberg contended.

"While in New Orleans," Weis-berg maintained, "Oswald was en-gaged in establishing an intelli-gence cover."

According to the Warren Re-port, Oswald printed an distri-buted leaflets for the "Fair Play for Cuba" program, Weisberg said. "However, there was no 'Fair Play for Cuba' program. Os-wald printed the leaflets only to draw attention to himself as pro-Castro."

Castro." "Wesley J. Lebeler, associate professor of law at UCLA, was the pillar of the staff in connection with the investigation on Oswald's New Orleans activities," he said. One of the FBI reports in con-nection with his investigation ends with the admission that its two and a half pages were hand typed by the author, Weisberg found. "But the report is now only two pages long," he revealed. "The original of this important document," Weisberg emphasized, "no longer exists." "This is typical of the Commis-sion," he concluded. Weisberg said that nothing but original documents should be ac-contable as avidence.
