## Exile Speaks on Lane's Book at Tulane

A Cuban exile leader suggested Thursday night that author Martin Lane was "a little off his head" when he wrote his book on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

mony of a 16-year-old Negro youth who was standing at Houston and Elm in Dallas at the time of the assassination.

The Negro, Dr. Bringuier said, told the commission that he had seen what appeared to be some sort of pipe in an upper story window of the book-depository.

The Cuban leader warned that forces are trying to bring about a revolution in this country. They are saying that anti-Castro Cubans were involved in the assassination.

"They know as long as the people of the United States believe in the institutions of the nation, such as the FBI, they cannot take over. When you begin to doubt your institutions—that's when they will try to take over."

He termed charges that right-wing extremists killed President Kennedy as "ridiculous."

Dr. Bringuier said Oswald did not know him and that he was a "right-wing extremist" and former chairman of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee in New Orleans.

Dr. Bringuier received a long ovation following his talk.

Relying heavily on extracts from the Warren Commission report during his almost two-hour talk, Dr. Bringuier said that he believed the former president was shot and killed by Lee Harvey Oswald from the Texas School Book Depositor Building in Dallas, Tex.

"If, as Lane claims, a shot from the front knocked flesh and brain tissue forward in the automobile, this is a new law of physics," the Cuban said.

He said that Texas Gov. John B. Connally told the commission that the shots came from the back, over his right shoulder.

Dr. Bringuier charged that the driver of the death car was not quoted in Lane's book or mentioned in the index.

The driver, Dr. Bringuier said, told the Warren Commission that the shots came from behind him, to the right rear of him. The driver also stated, the Cuban leader said, that he did not believe the shots came from the front.
