GARRISON SUBPOENAS WIDOW OF OSWALD

WIDOW OF OSWALD NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 24 (AP) — The widow of Lee Os-wald was subpoenaed for grand jury testimony today by Dis-trict Attorney Jim Garrison, who doubts Warren Commis-sion findings that Oswald alone assassinated President Kennedy. Mr. Garrison's office issued the subpoena for Mrs. Marina Oswald Porter, now of Richard-son, Tex., a Dallas suburb, to appear here Feb. 8 and 9 as part of Mr. Garrison's inquiry into the assassination. Assistant District Attorney James L. Alcock said investi-gators wanted to ask her what she knew about Oswals's ac-tivities in New Orleans during the summer of 1963. The Oswalds lived here dur-ing the summer preceding the assassination Nov. 22, 1963, in Dallas. It was during this sum-mer, Mr. Garrison maintains, that Oswald and others con-spired to murder President Os-wald.

BAKERSFIELD, Calif., Jan. 24 (AP) — Judge P. R. Borton rejected in Superior Court to-day Mr. Garrison's request that Loran Hall be returned to New Orleans to testify in the assas-sination inquiry. Judge Borton said that Mr. Hall's denial that he knew any of the alleged conspirators showed that he was either not a material witness in that in-vestigation or that he had com-mitteed perjury.
