In his ruling, Judge Borton said Hall's categoric denial that he knew any of the alleged con-spirators showed that he was either not a material witness in Garrison's investigations or that he committed perjury. Garrison had issued a sub-poena for Hall stating the Kern-ville man was in a unique po-sition' to observe events sur-rounding the assassination but Hall has denied that contention. Prior to Judge Borton's rul-ing, Hall told the court he ap-peared against his doctor's or-ders and that he will enter a Los Angeles area veterans hos-pital Thursday for treatment of Los Angeles area veterans hos-pital Thursday for treatment of

a liver ailment. In an interview after the hear-ing Hall said he expected Gar-rison to try other means to get him to New Orleans. I expect he may even file conspiracy charges against me, "Hall said. He said he feared for his life if forced to return to New Or-leans because of his admitted guerrila activities against the Castro government in Cuba.
