## JFK 'Dumping' Plan Denied by Sorensen

Former White House aide Theodore C. Sorensen said yesterday President Kennedy never gave the "slightest thought" to dumping Lyndon Johnson from the Democratic ticket in 1964. Evelyn Lincoln, personal secretary to the late President, said in a book to be published March 4 that she

asked her boss three days before his death about his preference for a 1964 running mate. She said: "He looked ahead and without hesitating, he replied, 'At this time, I am thinking about Gov. Terry Sanford of North Carolina. But it will not be Lyndon.'"

Sorensen, President Kennedy's closest staff associate and a long-time political adviser, was contacted by phone at his New York office and asked his assessment of this report.

"I was in constant conversation with the President about his political thinking in general and his thinking on 1964 in particular at that very period, and at no time did he ever entertain the slightest thought that Lyndon Johnson would not be his running mate in 1964," Sorensen said.
