DA Subpena Seeks Film of JFK Slaying

Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison has subpenaed Time, Inc., in an attempt to obtain the original Zapruder film of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Garrison, who issued the subpena yesterday, wants the motion picture film brought before the Orleans Parish grand jury April 4.

Life magazine, a subsidiary of Time, Inc., bought the film from Abraham Zapruder an amateur Dallas, Tex., photographer.

Garrison said copies viewed by "federal employes" are not "accurate reproductions of the original film." The subpena is to be served

original finit. The subpena is to be served on a Time representative in Louisiana, if possible. As an alternative, it was to be sent to the Louisiana secretary of state who would forward it to Time headquarters in New York City.
