> "INASMUCH as Rev. J. D. Grey in his capacity as president of the MCC necessarily knew that a decision was pending concerning his man-aging director, this office in-tends to learn the purpose of his clandestine efforts to contact the Supreme Court and the matters brought up by him during his visits. "This office intends to learn the purpose of his visits to the

> office of the Supreme Court and the subject matter

brought up by Rev. Grey in any discussion which he may have initiated.

"THIS INQUIRY should not be considered necessarily as a reflection on the Supreme Court because no member sought out Dr. Grey. How-ever, this office expects and will demand an explanation from Dr. Grey."

Kohn was cited for contempt by Criminal District Judge Matthew S. Braniff. He spent the night of Dec. 14 in Parish Prison before the Supreme Court stayed the action pending a hearing.

Garrison and Kohn have been frequently at odds since Garrison became DA in 1962.
