

'Murder List' Is Charged By Teamster

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP)—Six union members have been "singled out for murder" by officials of the Labor Management Commission of Inquiry, claims a Teamsters Union member in a federal court petition.

The petition was filed yesterday by Roderick Jenkins, one of several union members charged in connection with a brawl at a Plaquemine, La., construction site.

Jenkins alleged in the pleading that the officials would be granted "complete immunity" by Gov. John McKeithen if any of the six Teamsters were shot and killed.

The petition said a conspiracy is in effect by the governor and labor - management officials to replace the leadership of Teamsters Local 5 with officials friendly to Teamsters Union President James R. Hoffa.

The suit identified the Teamsters Union members allegedly "singled out for murder" as J. D. Arnold, Wade McClanahan, Terry George, Jerry Sylvester, Hugh Marionneaux and Lloyd Kitcher.
