

## OPEN LETTER

During the recent Wisconsin Primary the Committee to Reopen the Investigation of the Kennedy Assassination urged candidates for the Presidency to address themselves to the important public questions which have arisen out of the slaying of President Kennedy. We felt that any candidate presenting himself as a serious alternative to the present administration and its policies should at least be willing to pledge that if he were elected President he would make public all the information relating to the assassination which is now secreted in the National Archives. We offered two candidates—Governor Stassen and Senator McCarthy—the opportunity of publically discussing the Kennedy assassination and its related issues with either Mark Lane or Jim Garrison. Unfortunately, Stassen rejected the offer as being too "sensational" and "extraneous," while Senator McCarthy did not even bother to respond to our invitation. The members of the Committee feel that the Kennedy assassination is a political question of the utmost importance;
