

Open Letters During the recent Wisconsin Frimary the Committee to Re-open the Investigation of the Ken-nedy Assassination urged candi-dates for the Presidency to ad-dress themselves to the impor-tant public questions which have arisen out of the slaying of Pre-sident Kennedy. We felt that any candidate presenting himself as a serious alternative to the pre-sent administration and its po-licies should at least be willing to pledge that if he were elected President he would make public all the information relating to the assassination which is now secreted in the National Ar-chives. We offered two candi-dates—Governor Stassen and Se-nator McCarthy—the opportu-nity of publically discussing the kennedy assassination and its related issues with either Mark Lane or Jim Garrison. Unfor-tunately, Stassen rejected the of-fer as being too "sensational" and "extraneous," while Senator Mc-Carthy did not even bother to respond to our invitation.
