Captain ROBERT KENNETH BROWN, The School Brigade, Fort Benning, Georgia, advised that he has been active in Cuban matters for several years and during the Spring of 1963, in connection with anti-Castro activity, he was in contact with the National States Rights Party in Los Angeles, California.

In connection with this, he contacted Dr. STANLEY L. DRENNAN, 10000 Wilshire Drive, North Hollywood, California, who is in the National States Rights Party. BROWN once while a guest at Dr. DRENNAN's home. In general conversation that he could not recall but what the organization needed was a group to get rid of KENNEDY, the Cabinet and Americans for Democratic Action and maybe the people. BROWN stated that he considered the "blackpot," however, as DRENNAN conversation, he gained the impression that DRENNAN was propositioning him on this matter.

BROWN stated that he is a Reserve Officer and has been to Cuba several times. Up to 1960, he was pro-Castro. He stated his conversation with DRENNAN to STEVE [unclear] a freelance writer, Miami, Florida.

BROWN stated that he was again in contact with DRENNAN in the Summer of 1963 and DRENNAN revealed he had been viewed by the Secret Service concerning his remarks.
