## Capital DA Given U.S. Phone Da

(States-Item Bureau) BATON ROUGE-The U.S. Justice Department today turned over records it has compiled on a reputed telephone link between a rackets figure and the state capitol to East Baton Rouge Parish District Attorney Sargent Pitcher, the States-Item has learned.

Pitcher acknowledged the 54-page document was furnished him containing infor-mation he has been seeking for the past seven months on calls between a number re-putedly that of Jefferson Parish rackets figure Carlos Marcello and a phone in the of-fice of the speaker of the House.

THE DOCUMENT, believed to be a resume of an intensive FBI investigation of toll call

slips on long distance calls, was delivered early this morning to the Baton Rouge district attorney.

Pitcher told the States-Item he had been advised the information was for official use only. He said he could not even say if it was a resume even say if it was a resume of calls or the toll slips themselves.

Justice Department, which has been uncooperative for several months in furnishing the information, had de-clared previously that the FBI had destroyed original

copies made of toll calls.

Pitcher countered he didn't believe it, but asked the Justice Department two months ago to let him examine the resume.

the Justice Department records furnished Pitcher per-tained only to the telephone maintained in the speaker's office for C. H. "Sammy" Downs, unpaid administrative assistant to Gov. John Mc-Keithen.

Life magazine had disclosed last September that calls were made from the phone in a motel office in Jefferson Par-ish, reportedly that of Marish, reportedly that of Marcello, to Aubrey Young then an aide to the governor. Young and Downs have both denied receiving any calls on that phone from Marcello.

McKeithen last September asked Pitcher to investigate the telephone connection.

Additional records of calls

Additional records of calls made to other numbers will also be sought by the district attorney, it was learned.
