

Photo of Ray Near JFK Slaying?

NEW YORK (AP)—The head of a research group looking into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy said today a photograph of a man arrested near the assassination scene in Dallas just after the shooting strongly resembles a sketch of James Earl Ray, in the killing of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Trent Gough, a Canadian actor, who is chairman of a group calling itself the Kennedy Assassination Inquiry Committee, compared the sketch and the photograph and said, "It's identical." They both show a long-nosed, thin-lipped man.

The photograph is of one of three men arrested in a railroad freight yard in Dallas Nov. 22, 1963—the day Kennedy was slain. The man was described as drunk at the time.

Gough said the three men were arrested by Dallas Police Sgt. D. V. Harkness and were turned over to his superior.

He said, "there is no positive identification of any of the three."
