## PROBE DEPOSITIONS Assistant DAs Meet With Shaw Attorneys

Assistant District Attorneys James L. Alcock and Andrew Sciambra were closeted with defense attorneys for Clay L. Shaw for two and a half hours today as Shaw's attorneys attempted to take depositions from them.

Federal Dist. Judge Frederick J. R. Heebe-after granting

a temporary restraining order preventing the trial of Shaw in Criminal District Court next week—signed an order allowing Shaw's attorneys to take depositions from Alcock, Sciambra and two of the district attorney's investigators, Lynn Loiselli and Louis Ivon.

District Attorney Jim Garrison yesterday released a letter of instruction to all members of his staff, telling them not to answer any questions whatsoever about the DA's investigation of President Kennedy's assassination.

Ivon was questioned yesterday but did not answer any questions relating to the investigation.

Before entering the conference today in the offices of William Wegmann, one of Shaw's attorneys, Alcock and Sciambra said they were not going to reveal any information about the probe to Shaw's attorneys.
