Resident of BR Charged with **Public Briber**

BATON ROUGE - Agents for the State Labor-Manage-ment Commission and the East Baton Rouge district at-torney's office today arrested a Baton Rouge resident on two counts of public bribery involving a case pending against Teamster boss Ed-

ward Grady Partin.
Thomas E. Holland, who
was described as an oilman and a former candidate for mayor of Baton Rouge, was charged with offering a bribe to Erby Aucoin of New Orleans to change his testimony.

PARTIN, controversial boss of Teamers Local No. 5 in Baton Rouge, was charged with aggravated battery in Ascension Parish on the basis of a statement by Aucoin that he was threatened by the union leader and other union members. members.

Aucoin testified at a hear-ing of the Labor-Management Commission that the incident the construction of a stock car racing track he was photographing. Aucoin was a cameraman for a New Or-leans television station.

According to the Labor-Management Commission, Hol-land offered Aucoin \$1,800 and a \$25,000 a year job with a firm called Scope Internation-

against Partin.

The incident allegedly occurred May 14, according to the charges against Holland.
