

Garrison Must Delay Shaw Trial

New Orleans

A Federal court yesterday ordered District Attorney Jim Garrison to postpone the September 10 assassination-conspiracy trial of businessman Clay L. Shaw until the United States Supreme Court can act on Shaw's countersuit against the district attorney.

Shaw was scheduled to be tried on a charge that he conspired with the late Lee Harvey Oswald and others to assassinate President John F. Kennedy in 1963.

A three-judge panel said yesterday that the Supreme Court could not possibly act on Shaw's request for an injunction by September 11. The same lower court panel dismissed Shaw's suit last month but that decision is being appealed to the high court.

Shaw charged in his suit that Garrison has conducted a reign of terror against him and has deprived him of his constitutional rights. Shaw was arrested March 1, 1967. His trial has been postponed several times.
