
Kennedy Kin Named In Suit

Nashville, Tenn.

Stephen Smith, a brother-in-law of the late President John Kennedy, has been named in a Federal court petition as the man who provided \$3000 to get evidence against an attorney for James Hoffa.

Maclin PM Davis, attorney for Z. T. Osborn Jr., filed a motion asking that Smith of New York be required to testify at a Federal court here Monday.

The motion for subpoena said Smith provided \$3000 that government investigator ~~Walter Sheridan~~ paid to a former Nashville policeman for information on Osborn. However.

Osborn was attorney for Teamsters President Hoffa when the latter went on trial here in 1962 on a conspiracy charge. A mistrial was declared and Hoffa and Osborn later were convicted of jury tampering.

Robert Vick, the former policeman, testified Osborn asked him to offer \$10,000 to a prospective juror to vote for acquitting Hoffa.
