## GRANTED

District Attorney Jim Garrison will take a dispute between Aaron M. Kohn and City Councilman Eddie L. Sapir to the Orleans Parish Grand Jury.

Kohn, managing director of the Metropolitan Crime Com-mission, has charged that Sapir has had "continuous contact" with rackets figure Carlos Marcello.

Sapir contends that Kohn is "wicked and malicious liar."

COUNCILMAN announced this afternoon that Garrison's office had agreed to a grand jury hearing of the charges after he con-ferred with Garrison by telephone and with Garrison's top aides at the DA's office this afternoon.

Sapir said he was told that both he and Kohn "would be

given an opportunity to be heard by a grand jury, which I welcome."

"After we have been heard I'm confident that Mr. Kohn will be proven once again to be a wicked, malicious and irresponsible light?" Sonir coid. responsible liar," Sapir said.

SAPIR SAID HE talked to Charles Ward and James L. Alcock in person and con-ferred with Garrison by phone during the conference.

Sapir brought with him transscripts of last Thursday's City Council meeting, in which the executive secretary of the Metropolitan Crime Commission questioned what he de-scribed as "continuous con-tact" between the councilmen and Marcello.

Kohn and the Crime Com-mission has asked for a City Council hearing into the charges of connections be-

tween Sapir and Marcello.
Sapir said he would show
the district attorney what

Specifically, said Sapir, he wants Kohn to testify on two

points:

1. That the councilman's interest in a bingo ordinance pending before the City Coun-

The clash between Kohnand Sapir resulted from Kohn's appearance at the City Council meeting last Thursday.

AT THE TIME, the council was considering an ordinance offered by Councilman James A. Moreau that would allow charitable bingo. The Legisla-ture approved a bill in its recent session that would allow Orleans Parish to legalize this type of bingo provided the City Council approves it.
