Aaron M. Kohn, managing director of the MCC, raised the issue at a council meeting a week ago when he ac-cused Sapir of having "con-tinuous contact" with Jeffer-son Parish rackets figure Carlos Marcello.

SAPIR HAS RETALIATED by calling on the Orleans Parish Grand Jury to look into the possibility that Kohn

is guilty of intimidation of public officials. Yesterday the district at-torney's office told Sapir that both he and Kohn would have a chance to tell their stories to a grand jury. Sapir has called Kohn "a malicious

After today's closed meeting, council president John
J. Petre was expected to
transmit the council's decision on the hearing to the
MCC via letter.

THE MEETING WAS held in the City Planning Commis-sion's office with City Attor-ney Alvin J. Liska sitting in.

Kohn's original charge last week came during a stormy debate over an ordinance that would legalize charitable bin-

go in the city.
"I believe the community would be interested in know-ing whether Mr. Sapir, in his deliberations on this matter is primarily interested in the public interest or in the interests of persons with whom he happens to be par-ticularly close," Kohn said.
