Tape No. 81

Sony 102:

Weisberg begins by bringing Garrison's case up to date.

45 Eberhard Deutsch is a friend of Garrison's; Garrison named son after him.

100? Role of press in cover-up.

132 Sirhan. No direct tie-up with assassination, but close parallels. Sirhan not alone. Crispin Curriel Gonzales, young man who committed suicide in Mexican jail. (See file, Robert Kennedy, 6 Jul 68.)

325 No connection between nomination of Fortas and keeping Archives closed. Archives closed by executive order; not a judicial decision.

400 Resemblance between "Frenchy," arrested right after assassination, and sketch of King's murderer.

430 No involvement of LBJ in assassination; if involved, would have mortgaged the remainder of his life to those responsible.

450 Guns between RFK and White House: Weisberg was told they were CIA guns. Weisberg had predicted RFK's death in letter 17 Jan to prominent California official who was a friend of both Kennedy brothers.

485 Caller says he has information which he has been reluctant to send Weisberg by mail; arranges to deliver it in person.

550 If Edward Kennedy runs for presidency and wins he won't make it; the only way he can is to say openly he will have a full investigation of JFK assassination. Believes all these assassinations, including that of Martin Luther King (?), are part of a coup d'etat.

580 Listener asks about book (title not given) published in Switzerland, in French and German. Weisberg says it might be published abroad in English; has seen one chapter of the English version. Says book is persuasive but, unlike others, he does not believe it is valid. (Book names H.L. Hunt.)

660 In discussion of Cuba, Weisberg suggests U.S. was behind plans to assassinate Castro under JFK as President. "Absolutely; I haven't the slightest doubt about it."

770 Caller: "You say [JFK assassination] was an attempt to take over the country by some faction or other?" Weisberg: "I say it happened that at the time John Kennedy was murdered we had a coup d'etat and that those assassinations which followed it were necessary to make that coup d'etat succeed."  
Caller: "It has not succeeded then - or it has?" Weisberg: "Yes, it has succeeded. We have had basic changes in policy ... " (Gives example of RFK's withdrawal of troops from Vietnam.)

- 910 Believes CIA responsible for deaths of King and RFK, that there was intelligence interest in these assassinations; adds names of Malcolm X, Lumumba, Guevara; at first Bandung conference the whole second echelon of Chinese leadership blown up by CIA bomb on plane. "I think the most experienced assassins in the modern world are the CIA."
- 990 Tells of death of unnamed man whom he interviewed the last time he was in New Orleans; three weeks later he died of an accident a man of his profession would be least likely to have.
- 1140 "One of the least obvious but I think most creditable" elements which might have been involved was "the Southeast Asia boys who are really tied up in this awful mess they had created and Kennedy was stopping it. Not for the first time, by the way; they did the same thing to him in Laos."
- ? On Dorothy Kilgallen: There is no such thing as a writer without notes, and she had the only private interview with Ruby; she certainly had some kind of notes and they didn't show up.
- 1390 "Nine frames of the Zapruder film that had been suppressed, that were in evidence but suppressed, I have finally forced loose from the National Archives, and I want to tell you that if you ever see the last of that series of nine frames of the Zapruder film and you see the look of utter horror on Jackie's face you will never forget it."

- 225 There is an FBI report that on the day Oswald crossed the border back into the U.S. at Miquel Aleman, his brother [unnamed - Robert Oswald? John Pic?] crossed at Laredo.
