Kohn Seeks Dismissal of Sapir Charge

Attorneys for Metropolitan Crime Commission Managing Director Aaron M. Kohn today filed a supplemental motion to throw out the public intimida-tion indictment against Kohn for questioning possible underworld connections of City Coun-

world connections of City Coun-cilman Eddie L. Sapir. The motion was filed by Kohn attorney Milton Brener before Criminal District Court Judge Edward A. Haggerty. IN THE MOTION to quash the indictment, Brener said Kohn's language in questioning the possible connections of Sa-pir and Jefferson Parish rack-ets figure Carlos Marcello. beets' figure Carlos Marcello, be-fore the City Council Oct. 3, con-tained no threats to the councilman.

Brener filed an earlier mobrener filed an earlier mo-tion, asking for a specific bill of particulars from the district at-torney's office stating the exact time, date and place of the al-leged offense. The attorney had also asked exactly what lan-guage constituted the alleged threat.

The DA's office replied the language was contained in the indictment.

In his appearance before the City Council, at the time considering an ordinance legaliz-ing charity bingo, Kohn asked Sapir whether in his deliberations on the ordinance he was considering the public interest, or the interest of persons who have benefitted in the past from bingo games, namely Carlos Marcello and members of his family.

KOHN SAID Sapir was in "rather continuous and close contact" with the Marcellos and he called for a public hear-

and he called for a public hear-ing on the matter. "The language of the indict-ment contains no threats what-ever," Brener told the court in his supplemental motion, "and it affirmatively reflects that the crime of public intimidation has not been committed." Brener urged that the indict-ment be thrown out. Judge Haggerty gave the dis-trict attorney's office until next Thursday to answer the supple-mental motion. He said he will hear arguments on the motions at that time.
