I charges were filed and then dropped in connection with the Feb. 26 death of a New Orleans babysitter.

After his reinstatement, in which the department agreed to reinstate him and drop charges, " Blanchard resigned from the de-partment and waived his suit for back pay and benefits be-cause of adverse publicity in the case. the case. C

The commission had granted st the reinstatement however, with-out passing on the validity of the charges against Blanchard. The commission took under advisement, p e n d i n g recom-mendations of the Fraternal Or-der of Police, a request by po-lice for injury benefits for men thurt "on the job" but not neces-sarily while in pursuit of a vio-lator.

lator. ìı Police contend that unless a police officer is injured while in actual "hot pursuit" of a criminal, he currently is not covered for injuries sustained oj a W n ci while working.

Fucci appealed to the com-mission after he was cut in rank from probationary captain to lieutenant and suspended last July after the city alleged he was not home on sick leave July 27 as required and failed to notify the department where he could be reached. Counsel for Fucci held that Fucci was unaware of the ver-bal regulation, that he was pun-ished twice for the same in-fraction, and the punishment was too severe. was too severe.
