DA to Ask Subpena of JFK Autopsy

A Washington, D. C. attorney is expected to file next week a subpena at the request of Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison for the appearance here of Dr. James B. Rhoades, archivist of the United States, and photographic records connected with the autopsy on the body of President John F. Kennedy.

The subpena will ask X-rays of the late president after he was assassinated in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963.

Garrison's move was a new legal procedure to obtain the evidence for use in the Jan. 21 trial of Clay Shaw, a New Orleans businessman accused of conspiring to kill President Kennedy.

The district attorney previously had asked the U.S. Attorney here to produce the records, but this request was turned down.

The X-rays and photographs sought bear on the controversy concerning doubt about the number of bullets fired at the president
