

## JFK Guard Subpoenaed In Shaw Trial

New Orleans

District Attorney Jim Garrison edged closer yesterday to producing his own conspiracy theory of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy when testimony begins in the conspiracy trial of Clay L. Shaw.

A judge in Maryland ordered a former Secret Service agent, who was riding in the death car when Kennedy was killed in downtown Dallas, to testify at Shaw's trial.

The action came a day after Garrison subpoenaed former Texas Governor John Connally and his wife, Nellie, to testify in the district attorney's case against Shaw. The Connallys were riding in the car with Kennedy when he was hit.

"I don't think I can help," Connally said. He said he would not go voluntarily.

But Roy Kellerman, now an FBI agent after serving in the Secret Service, was ordered to testify at the trial of Shaw.

Kellerman was sitting be-

side Bill Greer, driver of the presidential limousine, in Dallas on Novmber 22, 1963, when Kennedy was shot. Two other FBI agents previously were ordered to appear at the Shaw trial.

Ten jurors have been seated in eight days of trying to select a panel to judge Shaw. To get the 10, attorneys had to question 25 prospective jurors, including 62 yesterday morning.
