

## Shaw Judge Orders Zapruder Films

NEW ORLEANS — (UPI) — Criminal District Judge Edward Haggerty today ordered Time, Inc. to send part of an exclusive film of the assassination of President Kennedy for use in the trial of Clay Shaw, charged with plotting to commit the murder.

Haggerty issued a subpoena at the request of District Attorney Jim Garrison to order Time to send 120 frames of the assassination film taken in Dallas Nov. 22, 1963, by dress manufacturer Abraham Zapruder.

The subpoena calls for the film to be delivered Feb. 25, an indication that Garrison plans to extend the trial for at least another month.

The number of prospective jurors questioned passed the 1000 mark today, with one alternate needed to complete the panel.

The defense moved yesterday to protect from arrest by Garrison a potential witness who has contradicted the story of Perry Raymond Russo, a star witness for Garrison.

The witness, Mrs. Harold McMaines, is said to be in seclusion in Iowa and declining to come here in response to the defense subpoena issued last month.

Defense Attorney F. Irwin Dymond said after filing the motion at the end of yesterday's court session that he wanted her protected "if she comes as a witness."
