He said the two talked for a while and then Shaw gave Oswald what appeared to be monev

Another witness bolstered the prosecution's claim that Shaw, who says he "never laid eyes" on Oswald, was also with him in a rural Louisiana town in 1963.

William Dunn, a Clinton, La., farmer and construction worker and the sixth prosecution witness, pointed out Shaw in the crowded courtroom.

Dunn said he had been working with the Congress of Racial Equality during a voter registration drive in late August or early September, 1963, and saw Shaw at the wheel of a parked Cadillac in front of the registrar's office. The witness said Oswald stood in line nearby to register.

Charles H. Steel Jr., an air conditioning worker, testified he met Oswald Aug. 16, 1963, at an employment agency and spent 10 or 15 minutes handing out Fair Play for Cuba leaflets in front of the International Trade mart with Oswald and another man he did not know.

Shaw was managing editor of the mart at the time.

Three other witnesses testified that they saw Oswald handing out the same leaflets on other occasions.
