

Gremillion Son Library Job Probe Is Asked

The State Code of Ethics Commission has been asked to investigate the promotion of the attorney general's son to head librarian in his father's office.

State Rep. Don Williamson of Vivian said promotion of Jack P. F. Gremillion Jr. is "a flagrant misuse of public trust . . . Our state and our people have had just about enough of this sort of thing."

Williamson requested the investigation.

The attorney general demoted head librarian Marina Warner to make room for the promotion.

The promotion followed recent news stories reporting that Gremillion's son made more than the librarian when he held the assistant's post.

The younger Gremillion makes \$550 a month, the assistant makes \$415 a month. The attorney general's son made the higher salary even though he was attending law school at the time.
