Aycock Enters Governor Race

BATON ROUGE (AP)-Lt. Gov. C. C. Taddy Aycock to-day announced he will be a candidate for governor in the 1971 Democratic primary.

Aycock made the surprise announcement at the weekly luncheon of the Baton Rouge Press Club.

"LOUISIANA HAS been mighty good to me. I have been in the Legislature, the speaker of the House, and I'm in my third term as lieutenant governor," he said. "I know it's a tough job and I feel I have the background. To anticipate your question, I will be a candidate for gov-ernor in the forthcoming gu-bernatorial primary." bernatorial primary.

Aycock has long been considered as the prime candi-date for governor in the 1971 race.

AYCOCK TOLD the group that he had no running mate

that he had no running mate-in mind. He said it was too early to select one. The timing of the announce-ment was the biggest sur-prise. Many expected him to wait until perhaps next year to make his announcement. The lieutenant governor also said he sees two group

also said he sees two grave crises in Louisiana-one in education and one in fiscal affairs.

HE SAID the school deseg-regation guidelines of the federal government will result in a federal takeover of the school system.

He said he didn't know He said he didn't know what the answer is. It is not mass civil disobedience or through the U.S. 5th Circuit Court of appeals, he said. "The answer is not with the governor, and the legisla-ture."

ON THE state's fiscal cris-is, he said, "I don't think we can continue to operate much longer on a bond issue basis." Either the state will have to start economizing or raise taxes, he said.
