## Grand Jury Hears Lawyer For Embattled Bail Fir

The attorney for the Maryland National Insurance Company, which owes \$720,775 in bail bond forfeitures, today spent more than two hours before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury.

Ralph Kaskell appeared at 9:15 a. m. when the jury convened for the day.

First Asst. Dist. Atty. James Alcock said Kaskell was appearing voluntarily.

ON JULY 4, the grand jury indicted two lawyers, Milton P. Masinter and Thomas To-ranto Jr., on charges of corrupt influencing in alleged at-

tempts to bribe former Asst. Dist. Atty. Charles Ray Ward not to press for collection of Maryland National bail bond forfeitures.

Masinter and Toranto have

said they are not guilty.
On June 19, Ward accused Kaskell of attempting to "blackmail" the DA's office into settling the Maryland National claim for \$100,000.

Ka's kell denied Ward's charges

charges.

Assistant Dist. Atty. Shirley Wimberly Jr., who now is re-sponsible for collection of bail bond forfeitures, was to be the grand jury's next witness this afternoon

ATTEMPTS BY the com-

pany to restrain the DA's office from attempting to collect Maryland National's forfeitures currently are in federal court. A restraining order has been issued preventing the DA's office from col-lections or moving to stop Maryland National from op-

erating in Louisiana.

Maryland National officials say many of the bonds that were forfeited were based on stolen bonding powers.
On Tuesday the Orleans

Parish Criminal Court judges said they will not accept any more bonds written on Maryland National. The company has filed a motion asking the judges to rescind their order and an open hearing is ex-pected in four or five days.
