Presidio Suit Dismissed

Levin has dismissed a restraining order obtained by a minister who said an AWOL soldier at the Presidio had been beaten.

At the request of Assistant U.S. Attorney Steven Cazan, Judge Levin dismissed the suit brought by Pvt. Paul McArdle against the Army.

"I withdraw my suit against the Army of my own free will and volition," said Pvt. McArdle, in a statement released by the Sixth Army information office at the Presidio vesterday.

No Presure

"I was under no pressure to make any retraction what-

soever."
The Presidio officer said Pvt. McArdle "indicated that his action was based on his desire to disassociate himself from the Rev. Raymond Broshears and because of his adverse and substantially in-accurate publicity accorded prior to further action.
