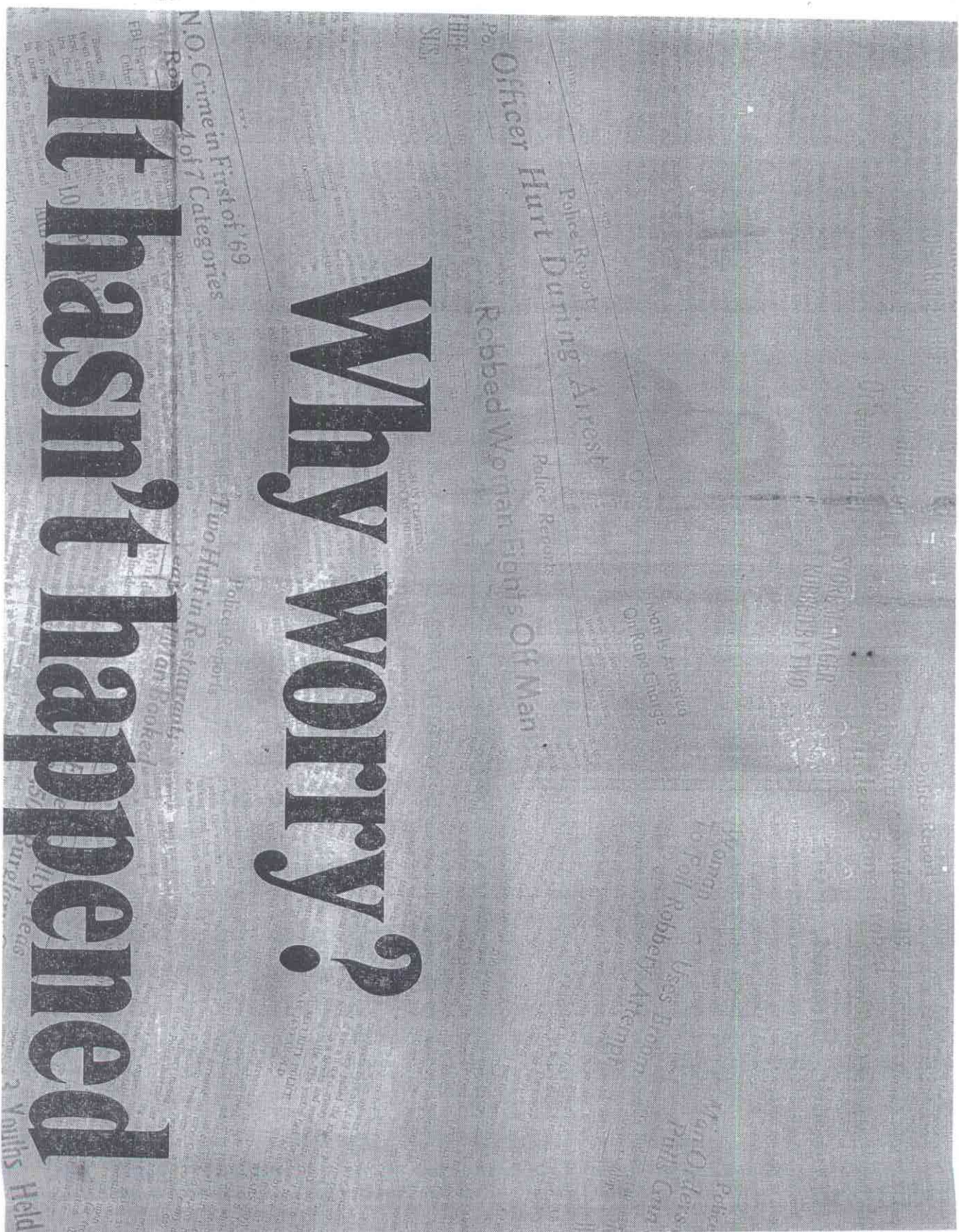

On September 30, three men were arrested on charges of loitering in the 1200 block of Sixth St., and were booked with illegal possession of marijuana.

Also on September 30, \$5,900 was stolen from a shop on Washington Ave. On October 1, police responding to a complaint of an attempted burglary in progress arrested three youths who allegedly tried to break into a building on Franklin Ave.

Also on October 1, a man raped a 16-year-old girl at Earhart and S. Liberty and escaped in an automobile which was possibly driven by a woman.

Also on October 1, Fifth District police reported the burglary from a No. Roman St. residence of more than \$1,900 worth of property. Taken from the home was a trunk stole valued at \$800, jewelry valued at \$550, fishing equipment valued at \$500 and \$40 in cash. On October 2, a 24-year-old man was in fair condition at Charity Hospital with stab

wounds he received from a man he was attempting to take to the hospital. The assistant was booked with aggravated battery.

On October 3, burglars took an estimated \$2,050 in cash and jewelry from a West End Blvd. residence. The thieves entered the residence by way of a front window and took the property from a small safe, which police said was unlocked. Stolen cash totaled \$400 and the rest of the property was in jewelry, police said.

On October 4, meat, milk, cakes, pies, beer, cigars and cigarettes with a total value of \$827 were stolen from a food store on Fourth St.

The list of crimes is endless, the list continues to grow. How long will it be before crime strikes you, your family, your house, your business? Your chances of escaping are less and less each day. District Attorney Jim Garrison has said he intends to continue pro-

cuting the Clay Shaw case even though a 12-man jury found Shaw innocent after deliberating less than an hour.

While Garrison played games with the Shaw case justice spun its wheels. Harry Connick has brought out the fact that 1100 criminals were turned loose on bail bonds totaling \$1,300,000. These bonds have been forfeited and the parish of Orleans stands to lose all but \$75,000 of this money, money which could have been used to hire 300 policemen for a year or to purchase 400 squad cars. This money was jeopardized when the district attorney's office failed to collect bonds of 1100 defendants who failed to appear for trial.

If you're not worried because muggings, rapes and murders seem to always happen in the other man's family, stay home on election day.

If, however, you are concerned, you might involve yourself in the Harry Connick campaign. Connick is a conscientious attorney pledged to be a full time District

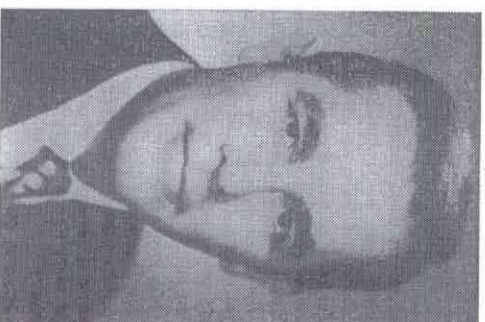
