Rabin Failed To Visit Prison, Minyard Says

Coroner candidate Dr. Frank Minyard charged that incumbent Dr. Carl Rabin failed to inspect Parish Prison as required by law and indi-rectly contributed to the re-cent prison s c a n d a l that shocked the city.

Addressing the Carrollton Rotary Club at Lenfant's Restaurant yesterday, Dr. Minyard said the coroner is required by law to periodically inspect Parish Prison and issue a report sue a report.

"The incumbent has never visited the prison and certain-ly has never issued a report," Dr. Minyard said.

"IF I AM ELECTED coroner," he promised, "you can be certain that I will both inspect the prison monthly and issue reports that will be available to the press."

Dr. Minyard said if he were coroner, the scandal, involving charges of sexual molecular hands of the sexual hands of the sexua lesting by a 21-year-old pris-oner, would have been avoid-

ed.
"If the coroner had made a report on conditions at the prison public before the tragic incident, the community could have expressed its indignation before the situation got com-pletely out of hand," Dr. Minyard said.

ON OTHER TOPICS, Dr. Minyard said he is personal physician to Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison.

Dr. Minyard said he has been Garrison's friend for a number of years as well as his personal physician. Dr. Minyard said he performed a hernia repair operation on Garrison.

"As for my being an inde-pendent coroner, I'm an honest man and Jim Garrison is an honest man. There would never be anything dishonest between us. I would not do anything dishonest for anyone and I am confident Mr. Garrison would never ask anything dishonest of me," Dr. Min-yard said in reply to a ques-

DR. MINYARD emphasized that in cases where the DA's office had a particular interest, such as the death of David Ferrie which figured prominently in the Clay Shaw case, "you can be certain that I would be scrupulously honest."

The candidate for coroner told the Rotary meeting he hopes to establish a coroner's office that goes beyond the basic functions assigned to the office.

He told of the need for public information programs in traffic safety, anti-drug programs, public safety and organ transplants. He also organ transplants. He also stressed the need for metha-done programs to help rehabilitate drug addicts.

"I'm not suggesting that "I'm not suggesting that the coroner's office take over these areas from presently responsible agencies," Dr. Minyard said. "I do believe the coroner's office should be a key participating partner in these areas with the goal of preventing needless loss of life."? life."
