"IT IS AN ISSUE because Jim Garrison says he is going to continue his investigation," Ward said. "He is going to retry Shaw for perjury and indicated the other day that additional charges are going to be filed against Shaw."

Ward said he doesn't believe New Orleans can stand is whether Garrison will be "another four years of the same investigation, the same trial, the same bizarre press releases.

HE ADDED, "ON Nov. 8 the same New Orleans brand of common sense that saved Clay Shaw with an innocent verdict reached in less than an hour will end the reign of
