Medina Sees New Pattern Of Voting

Dr. Ignacio Medina Jr. told a gathering at the Press Club of New Orleans today his showing in the coroner's race in the Nov. 8 Democratic primary

Nov. 8 Democratic primary "demonstrates a fresh new vot-ing pattern in this city." Dr. Medina, who received no endorsements from mayoral candidates, will be in a runoff Dec. 13 with Dr. Carl H. Rabin, the incumbent, who was on the ticket of James E. Fitzmorris Jr.

Jr. "It is reassuring and gratify-ing that the voters have recog-nized my independence," said Dr. Medina. If he wins in the second primary, he added, the coroner's office "will be run in the same efficient, progressive and scientific manner as before, when I was acting coroner.'

DR. MEDINA was an as-sistant to former Coroner Nicho-las Chetta, who died in office in May last year. He served as acting coroner from that time until July, 1968, when Dr. Rabin was appointed by Gov. John J. McKeithen on the recommenda-tion of Mayor Victor H. Schiro. Answering criticism by Dr tion of Mayor Victor H. Schiro. Answering criticism by Dr. Rabin that he is making "devi-ous use" of an Orleans Parish Medical Society poll on the coroner election, Dr. Medina said the poll "was authorized and supervised by the medical society's board of directors, made up of doctors from all of society's board of directors, made up of doctors from all of the city's principal hospitals." In the poll, Dr. Medina led with 334 votes, or 49 per cent of the returned ballots from about hold of the Medical Soc

about half of the Medical So-ciety's membership. Dr. Rabin was second with 29 per cent.

In his Press Club talk today, Dr. Medina said the merits of the coroner's office "are none without the support of the medical profession of the city."

HIS 18 YEARS of experience as an assistant in that office, said the candidate, also makes the more qualified conhim

tender. Dr. Medina said he "cer-tainly would" be willing to serve on lunacy commissions wit前 psychiatrists. (Dr. Rabin is reported to have stated he would not, since only psychia-trists are qualified to serve on such a board.)

Dr. Medina said he believes it is "a very good idea" to appoint a psychiatrist and also non-psychiatric physician to a the commission.

The candidate made his re-marks at the Press Club's Newsmaker luncheon, spon-sored by Sigma Delta Chi, a professional journalistic fraternity.
