## DA Refuses Rob Case Against 3

The District Attorney's office has refused charges against three youths who were arrested and booked by police in connection with the Jan. 5 shooting and attempted robbery of a New Orleans cab driver.

New Orleans cab driver. The three youths are Tyrone Sharrett, 18, 2411 Lafitte; Edward Touchard, 19, 637 N. Roman, and William Guy, 17, 641 N. Derbigny.

The cab driver, Clarence Honore Jr., 40, 1336 Elysian Fields, was shot in the head in the 2100 block of Florida and drove into the path of a car moving uptown on Florida. In a collision that followed, the occupants of the other car, including three children, were shaken up but not seriously injured. Honore remains in Charity's

Honore remains in Charity's intensive care unit where hospital officials describe his condition as "stable."

Police said the three youths were arrested during a "routine pedestrian check" when it was thought they matched the descriptions of robbers given by another cab driver who had been held up.

The arrests of the three followed. The DA's office refused the charges on the grounds there was not sufficient evidence to prosecute.
