Mr. Haggerty, who was to retire in May from his position as court clerk, died last night at the age of 85. He resided at 1426

A native of New Orleans and a life-long resident of the First Ward, Mr. Haggerty, father of Criminal District Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr., cele-brated his 50th year in office last December.

Another son, Dan B. Hag-gerty, won a first primary vic-tory to succeed his father in November's Democratic elec-

tion.
Mr. Haggerty attended Jesuit High School and Tulane University before receiving his law degree at Loyola University in

He had been a member of Democratic state Central Committee from the First Ward since 1920 and was a member of the state Constitutional Convention in 1921. He also was named to serve as a delegate to the Democratic National Convention in 1928 and 1944.

Mr. Haggerty was noted for his sharp memory and frequent-

his sharp memory and frequently was sought out by office employes in the Criminal Courts Building to verify dates, names and events forgotten by others.

He served as chief deputy fire marshal for 11 years, and on Dec. 17, 1919, he was appointed by Gov. Ruffin G. Pleasant to fill the unexpired term of Lawrence Cassidy, clerk of of Lawrence Cassidy, clerk of Criminal District Court, who had died.

Since 1920 he had been re-

elected consistently.

His wife, the former Miss Georgianna O'Neil, died in 1964. Mr. Haggerty's late daughter, Mrs. Helen Sullivan, had served as her father's minute clerk for

many years.

Surviving, in addition to his two sons, are two daughters, Mrs. Dorothy Granen and Mrs. Bessie Haney; two sisters, Sister Mary Loyola, M.S.C., of Le-Mans, France, and Mrs. Sam Ott, Osyka, Miss.; 21 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.
