No Drinking on the Job, Judge Tells Grand Jury

NEW ORLEANS, March 4 (AP)—The Orleans Parish grand jury, sworn in today, was told by Judge Oliver P. Schulingkamp of Criminal District Court that he would

District Court that he would not allow them to drink alcolpolic beverages while they were engaged in their official duties, not even at lunch. The 12-man panel will sit for six months.

"The drinking of alcoholic beverages of any kind by any grand juror while performing his official duties, including while at lunch, is regarded by this court as improper and also in extreme poor taste," Judge Schulingkamp said in his charge.

"Questionable conduct by a grand jury could result in a cloud cast upon the validity of indictments returned by such jury," he said.

"Justice and fair play re-"Justice and fair play require that a citizen indicted by a grand jury be entitled to have such indictment returned by a grand jury in full possession of its faculties and not under the influence of alcohol." ence of alcohol."

JUDGE SCHULINGKAMP said he discussed this matter with each of the jurors before they were sworn in this morning.

The paragraphs on "deco-rum and propriety" were but a part of a 14-page charge to the jurors on their duties in

serving Orleans Parish and the court for the next six months.
