to consider the matter.

"We didn't make any recommendations before—we're going to make them now," said Wade prior to the meeting in McDougall's office.

THE COMMITTEE on May
1 released its findings on the
Life magazine allegations.
The report did not deal with
the magazine's specific references to Gov. John McKeithen
because of McKeithen's \$10
million libel suit against Life.
The investigation, in fact,

was limited to what the committee termed specific rather than general or vague allega-tions of Mafia influence or misconduct in those areas of government for which Mc-Keithen is directly responsi-

The original committee report did not come to any con-clusions nor did it make any recommendations, letting the evidence offered speak for itself.

THE MOVE TO add recommendations to the report comes at a time when the allegations made by Life in its April 10 edition have become the chief issue of the present 60-day session of the Legisla-

Four legislative measures calling for in-depth probes of the charges are now before

lawmakers.

A fifth measure dealing with the magazine article already has gained overwhelming House support.
