## **Attorney Files** Marcello Bids To Avoid Jail

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)-Anthony Friloux, attorney for Carlos Marcello, filed a series of motions late yesterday in an attempt to keep the Metairie underworld figure from going to jail.

Friloux asked for reduction of sentence and a delay of commitment for the 60-year-old Marcello who was convicted on charges of striking an FBI agent at the New Orleans International Airport.

He was turned down by the U.S. Supreme Court June 15 in a try to overturn a two-year sentence handed down by U. S. Dist. Judge John V. Singleton.

FRILOUX asked Judge Singleton to set a date for an oral hearing and that Marcello not be imprisoned until such a hear-ing can be held.

A second try for a Supreme Court rehearing failed Monday, the motion filed by the lawyer said. Marcello also has a motion before the U. S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals to stay the mandate.

Laredo U. S. District Clerk Bonifacio Lyendecker said yes-terday he has still not received the notice of the Supreme Court action turning down Marcello's appeal and until he does so J Judge Singleton can not take

jurisdiction in the case. The case against Marcello was first tried in Laredo where it u ended in a hung júry. A jury in a Houston later convicted him of the charge.
