MCC Board Backs Kohn in Police

The board of directors of the Metropolitan Crime Commission is standing behind its managing director, Aaron M. Kohn, in his latest controversy with the police department.

the MCC are approved by the MCC board of directors. This was true in the case of Mr. Kohn's Aug. 5 letter to Super-intendent Giarrusso.

3. We have the utmost confidence in our managing director, Aaron Kohn, and resent Kohn supplied MacHauer with attempts to impugn his char-

acter and abilities.

4. We are attempting to meet with Superintenders. Giarrusso in an effort to Giarrusso in an effort to maintain our relationship with the NOPD at a high and re-spected level. We have no intention of permitting this present controversy to be loud or inhibit the solving of problems of greater significance to our city.

5. We will make no further public statement on the pres-ent controversy until after our meeting with Superintendent Giarrusso and the Aug. 15
