Marcello Arrest Delayed by U.S

The Justice Department an-nounced today it will not at-tempt to put Carlos Marcello in jail while he awaits a Su-preme Court ruling on his ap-peal of a lower court's refusal to grant him a stay of sentence.

Marcello was convicted in 1968 of striking an FBI agent and was fined \$5,000 and sentenced to two years in jail. The Jefferson Parish rackets figure has appealed for a new trial on grounds the govern-ment suppressed evidence at his first trial and that a wit-ness for the government com-

ness for the government com-mitted perjury. Earlier this month the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals denied bail to Marcello while he awaited action on his bid for a new trial. The appellate court's decision was appealed

to the Supreme Court and Justice Hugo L. Black Friday deferred action on the request; to the full court, which does.

to the full court, which does not meet until Oct. 5. The Justice Department had the option of attempting to jail Marcello in the interim but has decided to hold off until the Supreme Court rules. Black's three-page opinion was critical of the govern-ment's conduct prior to the in-cident in which Marcello was arrested for assaulting the FBI man at New Orleans In-ternational Airport. He said there was sufficient evidence of government provocation of of government provocation of Marcello to justify a new trial but he said he is not sure whether the full court will vote to accept jurisdiction in the case.
