

Judge Gets Motions by Gremillion

A federal district judge yesterday took under advisement two motions by Atty. Gen. Jack P. F. Gremillion who will be tried Jan. 18 in the case of bankrupt Louisiana Loan and Thrift Corp.

Judge Frederick J. R. Heebe will study the motions, which ask for a reconsideration of the denial of a plea of immunity and for a consolidation of the charges in the LL&T case with a perjury case.

A trial date has not been set in the perjury case but Gremillion and four others will go on trial in January for alleged conspiracy, mail fraud, fraud in the sale of securities and sale of unregistered securities.

Also charged in the case are state Rep. Salvador Anzelmo; Ernest A. Bartlett Jr. of Fort Smith, Ark., former chairman of the board of the corporation; Charles Ritchey, former president, and Joseph Kavanaugh, a Baton Rouge attorney.
