Witness Tells of Borrowing To Help Garrison's Inquiry

(AP)—A New Orleans businessman testified today that he
borrowed \$30,000 from a bank
to help finance District Attorn
Jim Garrison's investigation of
the assassination of President
Kennedy and, he said, Mr. Garrison still owes him for it rison still owes him for it.

The testimony came in a hearing in Federal District Cou on a motion by Clay Shaw to prevent Mr. Garrison from taking him to court again, this time on a charge of lying to the jury that acquitted him in 1969 or conspiring to kill President Kennedy.

The witness, Willard Robertson, a car importer, said he had been president of an organization of businessmen formed to help finance the investigation by Mr. Garrison.
