LOS ANGELES (AP) -LOS ANGELES (AP) --Charges of conspiracy and grand theft were dropped yesterday against Dalton Smith, 46-y ear -old former New Orleans contractor who was accused of stealing al-most \$500,000 most \$500,000.

was accused of stealing al-most \$500,000. Smith, who was arrested in May, 1968, on a county grand jury indictment, was freed after Superior Court Judge Benjamin Landis granted a defense motion for dismissal. Smith's attorney, who en-tered the motion after the state rested its case, contend-ed that the prosecution had not presented sufficient evi-dence to convict. A poll of the jury showed that the jurors agreed with Landis' ruling. The prosecution ch a r g e d that Smith, now of Los Ange-les, conspired with a broker-age firm clerk in December 1967 to issue checks for stock they were not entitled to and for ficitious accustic.

they were not entitled to and for fictitious accounts. Smith is appealing a five-year federal sentence im-posed earlier this month aft-er being convicted in US er being convicted in U.S. Dist. Court of 18 counts of interstate transportation of sto-len and forged securities.
