

### U.S. Grand Jury Chosen In Garrison Bribery Case

NEW ORLEANS, Aug. 2 (AP)—A special 24-member Federal grand jury was chosen today to investigate bribery charges against District Attorney Jim Garrison.

The grand jury was ordered into session July 20 by United States District Judge E. Gordon West to sit for 18 months, if necessary, to inquire into charges brought against Mr. Garrison by a Federal inquiry group on organized crime.

The district attorney, two high-ranking officers and seven persons associated with the pinball industry were charged June 30 with violating the Federal organized crime law in connection with alleged payoffs to protect pinball operators.
