Retrial Won't Quit In

Partin Judge BUTTE, Mont. (AP) – U.S. Dist. Court Judge W. D. Mur-ray refused a request by fed-eral prosecutors yesterday to r e c u s e himself from the retrial of Edward Grady Par-tin of Baton Rouge, La., tin of Baton Rouge, La., charged with antitrust viola-tions and extortion.

The first trial of Partin, 46year-old business agent for a Baton Rouge Teamsters Union local, ended in a mistrial. A second trial was set for

Nov. 1 in Butte where the case was moved on a change of venue.

Wilford Whitley Jr. and Thomas P. Ruane, federal at-torneys who prosecuted Partin in the first trial, asked Mur-ray to recuse himself from presiding at the November trial. The judge denied the motion without further hear-ing ing.

Partin and Ted F. Dunham, Baton Rouge concrete executive, were accused of conspiring to monopolize the concrete business in Baton Rouge. Dunham was convicted in New Orleans at a trial presided over by Murray and is awaiting sentence.
