Gremillion New Trial Hearing Set U.S. District Judge Fred J.

Cassibry has scheduled a hearing at 2:30 p.m. Nov. 17 on a motion for a new trial for Attorney General Jack P. F. Gremillion, convicted Sept. 25 of five counts of perjury.

Gremillion was convicted of committing perjury when he testified under oath to a grand jury concerning his financial connection with the Louisiana Loan and Thrift Corp.

In his new trial motion filed yesterday, Gremillion charges Judge Cassibry wrongfully denied his motion to dismiss the indictment on the ground the testimony he gave was not given with a corrupt motive and was not material to the investigation of LL&T.

investigation of LL&T.

The motion also contends the truth or falsity of Gremillion's testimony was decided in the case in which Gremillion and two others were acquitted of conspiracy and fraud growing out of LL&T operations.

Further, said the motion, the perjury jury's guilty verdict was not supported by "substantial" evidence.
