Strate, Hoffa Co-Defendant, Will Be Paroled on April 3

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7 (UPI)

The United States Parole Board voted today to grant parole to Zachary A. Strate Jr., who was convicted with James R. Hoffa, former president of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, on charges of conspiracy and mail fraud in connection with the union's \$800-million pension fund.

The Parole Board chairman, George A. Reed, said Strate, 52 years old, a New Orleans builder and real estate developer, would be paroled April 3. Strate began serving a three-year indeterminate sentence at the Federal Correctional Institute, Téxarkana, Tex., on Feb. 12, 1971.
